

# CABINET CARE GUIDELINES

## DAILY CARE



To keep cabinets looking their best, cabinets should be dry dusted as a first-line cleaning. Clean up any spills, splatters, or water spots promptly with a microfiber cloth (Norwex). The sooner these spots are cleared off, the less chance they will stain or discolor the cabinetry. If needed, use a damp microfiber cloth to clean your cabinets, then dry it quickly with a dry, soft cloth.

## CLEANING PRODUCTS

Use natural products that won't scratch the finish or leave sticky residues. Mild, grease-cutting dish soap makes an ideal cabinet cleaner. Mix 2 tablespoons of dish soap into 2 cups warm water, then apply the mixture to the cabinets using a clean, soft cloth.



## AVOID THESE



Products that contain ammonia or abrasive powdered cleaners. Never use Scotch-Brite pads, Magic Erasers or Lysol wipes on your cabinets, they can blemish the coating and ruin the sheen. Also avoid oil-based products, silicone dusters, polishes, or anything that claims to clean and polish your cabinets will damage your painted finish. Bleach is also never recommended.

## MOISTURE

Too much moisture can be the enemy of wood and can damage the paint. Avoid hanging wet dishcloths or towels over cabinets or cabinet doors since prolonged exposure to water will damage the finish and may stain the cabinet.



## GREASE



Kitchen ventilation and grease filtration are important as they remove the aerosolized grease particles that can damage even the toughest finishes. Grease and food particles get harder to remove over time, and eliminating dried-on residue may require tough scrubbing.
